TYPE OF EVENT	The Joondalup Festival of Motoring is a multifaceted motoring and motorsport event that encompasses a variety of activities in and around the Joondalup CBD. These Regulations will primarily affect the Joondalup City Sprint but form part of the greater Joondalup Festival of Motoring, which encompasses a variety of events as details in the program.
VENUE / LOCATION	All events will take place within the Central Business District and Education precincts of Joondalup Western Australia.

The Event will be a SPRINT conducted under the National Competition Rules (NCR's) of the Australian Autosport Alliance Pty Ltd (AASA), these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Supplementary Regulations or Bulletins which may be issued. By entering this event you agree to comply with these regulations.

The Joondalup City Sprint will be a Sprint.

Vehicle Eligibility

This Event will be open to all categories of Automobiles as defined by AASA.

Due to a short liaison on public roads, all vehicles must be road registered or permitted.

Safety

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with AASA OH&S, Safety, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies.

VEHICLE SIGNAGE

Windscreen Stickers: Each Automobile will be provided with front and back windscreen numbers.

- FRONT FACING Please place in the top right corner of the windscreen (when looking at the front of the vehicle).
- REAR FACING Please place in the top left corner of the rear windscreen (when looking at the rear of the vehicle).

Door Plate: Competitors are requested to carry the Automobile number / sponsor door plate on the front door of both sides of the Automobile. The door plate is not to be modified without prior consent from the chief steward.

Where there are two competition numbers on an Automobile, the onus is on the competitor to ensure the unused number is hidden.

All stickers are required to be attached before scrutineering is completed.



OTHER INFORMATION

All Automobiles must comply with the AASA Regulations. Drivers apparel shall be as specified in <u>AASA Appendix 4 – Apparel Requirements</u> for Speed Events – Club. Automobiles must be adequately muffled.

Competitors must produce a valid and current:

- Vehicle registration papers or special use/unregistered vehicle permit as issued by state authority.
- Logbook (if issued).

Entries will be accepted in order of receipt unless otherwise specified.

The Organisers may refuse any entry. The Organisers may refuse any entry, for any reason, if deemed unsuitable or not within the style or aim of the competition without further explanation.

Entries from Competitors under 18 years of age must be countersigned/consented to by a parent/guardian.

The Organiser reserves the right to postpone or cancel the Event.

SMOKING

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.

EVENT OPERATIONS

The Event will be run over one competitive lap with a total distance of 1.7 km, with a bitumen surface. It is run in an anti-clockwise direction. Only one entry per *Automobile* will be accepted unless approval is sought from Organisers.

A map and road book showing the route will be provided at documentation.

Two COMPULSORY observation runs will be required prior to competition. Observation runs are restricted to 50kph maximum speed. Only the driver (and co-driver) are permitted in the Automobile for the observation runs. Helmets are not compulsory.

The Organisers will make every effort to give each competitor four timed runs. The slowest recorded lap will not count towards final results, and up to three timed runs will count towards all awards.

The Organisers will seed Competitors in a reverse order (slowest to fastest) which may be amended throughout the day on the grounds of safety. A start order will be published on the day, and Competitors will be required to stay in this order. The Organisers may publish a revised start order throughout the day.

The total of the fastest timed runs (up to the fastest three) will be utilised to determine the winners for Outright and each Category. In the case of two or more competitors having the equal fastest time, then it will be based on their 2nd and 3rd fastest times.



Time penalties will be added to competitor's times for being in breach of the following:

- (i) Hitting a No-Cut Corner Bollard 5 seconds
- (ii) Incorrect side of bollard or barrier, gaining a possible advantage 30 seconds
- (iii) Hitting a Plastic Barrier located on the road surface 5 seconds
- (iV) Hitting a Hay Bale / Steel Barrier (Delineator) 30 seconds

The Organisers may allocate additional awards in the Further Regulations.

Protests, if any, must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

Competition will be continuous. The onus is on each Competitor to make sure they have their correct number of runs. The Organisers may be required to halt competition to allow for the egress of adjacent residents and business operators.

Automobiles will start at approx. 30 second intervals; however, with the approval of the Stewards, the Organisers reserve the right to alter this.

Competitors are forbidden from overtaking a moving Automobile during their run, under no circumstances are they to overtake another Automobile unless that Automobile has stopped.

There will be several Red / Amber warning lights and Red / Yellow flags along the course. These are all considered to be the same **high-level warning**.

If a **high-level warning** is displayed at any location, a competitor must immediately make a significant reduction in speed. The Clerk of the Course may allow the Automobile(s) effected by the display of the **high-level warning** to contest the course again. If circumstances do not permit this, the Clerk of the Course will propose to the Stewards an allocated time for the Competitor for that run. No Competitor which is totally or partially responsible for displaying a **high-level warning** may benefit from this measure.

The Start Light sequence will be as follows:

- 10 seconds Red (Wait)
- 5 seconds Amber (Ready)
- 0 Green (Go)

The *Competitor* should "go on green" but their time will not start until they break the beam. The Green stays on for 5 sec, and then there is a short blip of the Red light until 10 seconds before next car where the above repeats. This "blip" is the "move up to the line" gap.

The abort sequence is Red and Amber together followed by alternating Red and Amber. If both lights come on at any time, including during the last 10 seconds, the Competitor must abort the start.

Timing will be to the tenth of a second. Times will be available on www.jfom.com.au during the Event. All results are provisional until 30 minutes after the conclusion of the Event, in accordance with the NCR.

The speed for all transports, liaison, moving to the start line, and from the finish line, will be low speed walking pace of 5kph.



Personal Accident Insurance is provided under the AASA Permit. Details can be found at www.aasa.com.au .

Competitors involved in accidents resulting in property damage are advised that they may be required to pay up to the first \$5,000 of any claim to rectify such property damage. This is the excess for the AASA insurance policy.

Scrutineering to be conducted as per the event schedule, appointments will be allocated.

Competitors are advised that any in-car video or moving film cameras must be installed in the Automobile prior to scrutineering so that the camera and its mounting can be inspected. Cameras are NOT to be attached to your person or helmet.

Driver's and Co Drivers Apparel shall be as specified in AASA Appendix 4 – Apparel Requirements for Speed Events – Club.

- i. Roll over protection, if installed, specified in AASA Appendix 1 Safety Cage Regulations Policy.
- ii. Full harness seat belts if installed, that comply with AASA Appendix 5 Occupant Restraint Systems Policy.
- iii. Fuel must be available commercially.
- iv. A fire extinguisher complying with AASA Appendix 3 Fire Suppression Systems Policy. All Drivers should have a fire extinguisher to meet AS1841.5, in configuration of minimum 1 x 0.9 kg securely mounted and maintained in accordance with manufacturers recommendation.
- v. Helmets and apparel complying with AASA Appendix 4 Apparel Requirements Policy.
- vi. Having, on the external coachwork, a blue triangle of sides 150mm, indicating the position of the battery.
- vii. Automobiles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions of 95dB (A).

Any oil or fuel spill must be reported to the Clerk of the Course. Spills must be cleaned up immediately and any contaminated soil removed from the area.

This Event may include a passenger ride activity. A strictly limited number of passenger rides will be permitted; however, will NOT take place during competition runs. This activity can only activated by the Organisers, to fulfill sponsorship or VIP requirements.

- a. Passengers MUST:
 - i. Wear the same protective equipment as a *Driver*
 - ii. Be fitted and restrained as required for each *Automobile* with consideration for their physical attributes
 - iii. Complete a Passenger Ride Entry Form and disclaimer
 - iv. Be at least 12 years of age
- b. Automobiles and apparel used must pass scrutineering.
- c. Only carry one Passenger per ride.

Each *Automobile* taking part must have the event rally plates / numbers and other event signage affixed prior to the VIP Rides. Further details concerning the location will be provided at a later date.

No team may place a passenger in a competition vehicle without the permission of the *Organisers*.



ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE - SUNDAY 4th MAY

All Competitors, Service Crew and Support Crews are required to arrive via Shenton Ave / Davidson Ave and proceed to the service are as per the attached map.

SERVICE ZONE

The Service Zone is located on McLarty Ave in Joondalup City Centre. Access via the attached map.

The Service Zone incorporates McLarty Avenue, and the two car parks known as McLarty Avenue Parking Station P1 and McLarty Avenue Parking Station No. 2. Some areas are uneven and if used as Service please be aware.

Please spread out – you can service in the streets.

The Organiser is keen to ensure there is enough room for all, and request that compliance with the following, in addition to your competition Automobile:

- Only one SERVICE VEHICLE may be parked in the Service Zone.
- SUPPORT VEHICLES are to be parked in the upper levels of the Reid Promenade Multi Deck Car Park (93 Boas Avenue, Joondalup); we will provide you with credentials at documentation.
- Please note this is a lock in event for competition crews and support vehicles.
- On the day, you must arrive BEFORE 7:40 a.m. as Davidson Terrace closes at 8:00 a.m.


